
HOW TO CURATE AN ARTFUL HOME




Start with a Strong Foundation: Crafting a Personal Aesthetic




• Mixing Periods and Styles: Creating a Layered, Lived-In Look




• Prioritize Handmade and Bespoke Pieces

- ♦ Etsy A carefully curated global marketplace for affordable vintage finds, handmade décor, and rare artisan crafts. Great for one-of-a-kind paintings, handwoven textiles, and antique decorative objects.
- ☆ Curator's Tip: Use search terms like "antique oil painting with provenance" or "handmade ceramic vessel" to narrow your results.
- ◆ Chairish A design-forward platform for high-end vintage furniture, art, and décor, curated with an eye for quality and craftsmanship.
- * Curator's Tip: When shopping for investment pieces, look for dovetail joinery, hand-carved details, and solid wood construction for longevity.
